The Selection Instrument for Flight Training or SIFT is the Army's test to see if a potential future pilot is academically qualified. The test lasts about three hours with a break in the middle and ranges from sections that will test your math and physics (an important skill for an aviator) to seeing how fast you can think and react.

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As things stand, 40 is the minimum Selection Instrument for Flight Training score needed to be considered for the next stage of Flight Training. However, the Army have officially stated that the passing score may be adjusted in the future. Any adjustment will take place based on data gained by comparing Aviation Training performance with SIFT scores.
